ANCHORAGE FORESTRY UPDATE

The Forestry Board is getting "pumped up" about the Anchorage calendar for 2008! The Board has gotten several photographs of local happenings and scenery from Anchorage residents and looks forward to more pictures that tend to coordinate the old with the new. The positive transitions that are unfolding can become a visual, yet permanent, reminder of our unique village. The deadline for submitting photographs is coming up so keep this project in bold type on your "to do" list. Photographs can be dropped off at City Hall. Thanks so much for your participation!

Young trees from the City's nursery will be given away to Anchorage residents around the beginning of November 2007. Choices will include 60 American Smokes, 60 White Pines, 59 Chestnut Oaks, 15 Katsuras, and 30 Burr Oaks. The pickup is traditionally scheduled for a Sunday but the exact date will be announced at a later time.

August is definitely here! Please do not forget to **WATER YOUNG TREES** to help them through this dry spell. The **TREEGATOR** is a plastic sack that attaches to the base of trees and provides a 6-10 hour water flow that eliminates evaporation and water runoff. Dark green in color, **TREEGATOR** fits up to a three inch diameter-based tree. Two to three can be zipped together to fit larger trees. **TREE GATORS** can be ordered at City Hall for \$20.00.

FAMILY EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS CLASSES



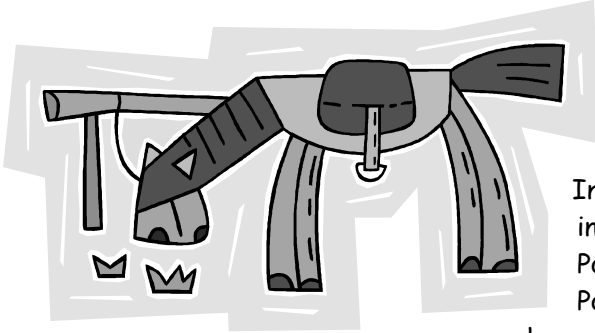
