**CURBSIDE
STORM DEBRIS
PICKUP**

Louisville Metro Public Works began curbside collection of storm debris in each pickup zone in Jefferson County on Monday, February 9. Crews started in the southeast end of the county in Zone E-15. Anchorage is overlapped by four of the pickup zones: E-7, E-8, E-12, and F5. To determine the zone you are in, log onto www.louisvilleky.gov, and then click on My Louisville "Map It" on the left side of the page. Enter your address and a map with your property will come up on the screen. A box will show your pickup zone.

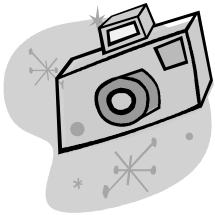
Click on the zone link and it will display a map of the zone you live in and a status of Collection Completed, Collection in Progress, or Coming Soon. Because the amount of debris is so large and unevenly dispersed throughout our community, Public Works cannot give residents an exact date for when their debris will be picked up.

Louisville Metro crews will pass through each street only once. Residents are requested to cut limbs into lengths of no more than six feet, and to bundle smaller branches. Some areas may take longer to clear than others.

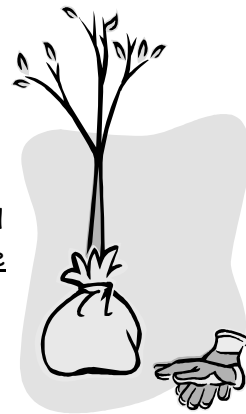

BURGLAR ALARMS

If you have a burglar alarm in your home it must be registered with the Anchorage Police Department regardless of the monitoring agency. Burglar alarm registration enables the police to have the necessary information to ensure the safety of the officers when they respond to an alarm. The registration information can also be used to help if a homeowner is out of town. If an alarm is activated while a resident is out of town and it is not registered, the police do not know who to contact to reset it, and could leave the home vulnerable until the homeowner returns. ANCHORAGE HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION

Through its policies Anchorage has demonstrated a commitment to identifying and preserving the features that establish the character of Anchorage. The architecture of Anchorage houses is a historical review of two hundred years of American building styles. With this in mind, in 1988 the Anchorage Historic Preservation Commission was established.

The Commission meets on the third Tuesday of each month to review building and demolition plans for those living in the historic district of the City. Homeowners are encouraged to contact City Hall at 245-4654 to get information regarding needed approvals and timelines for these approvals. As with any building project, homeowners need to begin with providing the City with a survey or plat of their property with the project drawn on to scale and with proper measurements included.

With the support and cooperation of homeowners and their contractors, the benefits of living in our exceptional community can be protected for our present and future residents.

LABOR OF LOVE BENEFIT FOR HOBBS MEMORIAL CHAPEL AND CEMETERY MARCH 18th
