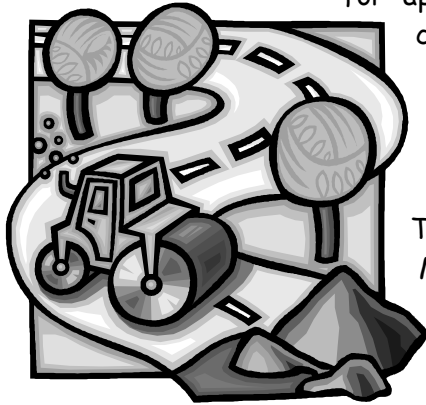

Hazelwood Sewer Extension Update

MAC Construction began blasting along Hazelwood Road on Monday, June 25, and will continue for approximately 30 days as the project moves eastward. The



construction team will drill and place dynamite each morning beginning at 7:00 a.m. and will set off those charges between 2:00 - 4:00 p.m. the same day. The contractor expects to blast about 200 feet per day.

To minimize work that would interrupt residents' weekends, MAC will be doing the construction Monday through Thursday, 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. This will allow make-up work on Fridays in case rain prevented work earlier in the week. MAC promises that while roads may be closed to through traffic at times, they will remain open to the streets' residents.

If you are a resident in or near the affected project area and haven't had Sauls Seismic photographically document your home prior to blasting, we encourage you to call Tommie Gaddie at 643-0723 to schedule a time to do so. This is for your protection and will avoid additional problems in the unlikely event that structural damage does occur. Also, it is suggested that during blasting you remove any irreplaceable or prized items from your walls. Some residents have raised concerns about storage of the photos taken of their homes. Sauls Seismic is in the business of making and storing these photos and they are stored only at Sauls. Only three people have access to them. If you would like a copy of the photos of your home on disc (or discs), contact Sauls at 459-2466. Discs will cost \$100 each, and the photos for most homes will fit on one disc.

Many residents have requested names of plumbers they can use to connect to the new sewers. The City will *not* recommend plumbers. However, if you have recommendations of plumbers that do this type of work, please call Nan at City Hall at 245-4654. Names of the plumbers and the person who recommended them will be compiled and the list will be available for residents. After a number of plumbers have been selected by residents, the City will offer orientation sessions to walk plumbers through the process of obtaining City permits.

Sewer project updates will be available each weekend on the City's website, cityofanchorage.org. Click on the tab called "Sewer Project". If you are having an event at your home in the area affected by sewer construction and need additional parking, call City Hall to arrange parking at City Hall or Wagner Park. ANCHORAGE PERMITS



During warm summer months many homeowners in Anchorage may be considering additions/alterations to their homes. As a reminder, the following improvements need a permit:

- Construction or demolition of a home or accessory building, an addition or alteration to a home, or the addition of a swimming pool. Keep in mind that if you are in the historic district or in a community with a homeowners association you will need additional approvals.
- Tree removal (needed only for trees with a 3" or greater diameter).
- A cut in the ground that exceeds 12 feet in length and of such depth that could affect any tree roots in the area of the trench, such as drainage work, the repair or installation of irrigation systems, burying phone, gas, electric or cable lines, septic systems, or the installation of a patio or driveway.

Landscaping or the removal of brush is not considered trenching, and, thus, would not need a permit. Contact City Hall at 245-4654 if you are unsure if your project requires a permit and to find out the procedure and timelines for those that qualify.

CELL PHONE RECYCLING PROGRAM AT CITY HALL

The Louisville Zoo has partnered with ECO-CELL to offer a cell phone recycling program to the citizens of Anchorage. Anyone wishing to recycle their unwanted cell phones, batteries, and accessories can bring these items to a collection box at City Hall. The Louisville Zoo will receive up to \$15.00 per phone collected.

FORESTRY NEWS

Newly planted trees need plenty of water, especially so during extended periods of dry weather. May area residents use TREEGATORS to help ensure the life of these tender, new trees. The TREEGATOR is a plastic sack that attaches to the base of trees and provides a 6-10 hour water flow that eliminates evaporation and water runoff. Dark green in color, TREEGATOR fits up to a three inch diameter-based tree. Two to three can be zipped together to fit larger trees.
