### Sewer Expansion Project In Anchorage

On April 11, 2006, the City Council held a special meeting to consider the passage of an ordinance to authorize the expansion of sanitary sewers to 95 lots in the area approximately bounded by Evergreen road on the west, East Osage on the north and the CSX tracks on the south and east. There was a large turnout of residents to speak for and against passage of the ordinance. After much discussion and a show of hands indicating overwhelming support, the Council voted unanimously to pass the ordinance.

The City is currently undertaking a process defined in Kentucky statutes for selecting an engineering firm to complete the detail design work and follow construction. Actual construction is not expected to begin until the first quarter of 2007. Watch *the Anchor Age* for periodic reports by Anchorage's project manager, Joe Roehrig (Anchorage.Joe@insightbb.com).
