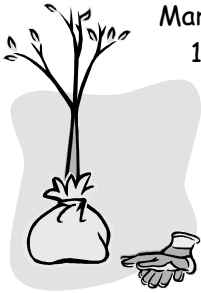

REQUIREMENTS FOR POLITICAL SIGNS IN ANCHORAGE: The maximum size of political signs is six square feet. They cannot be posted more than thirty days prior to the election and must be removed within five days after the election. The signs must sit back at least ten feet from the road edge.

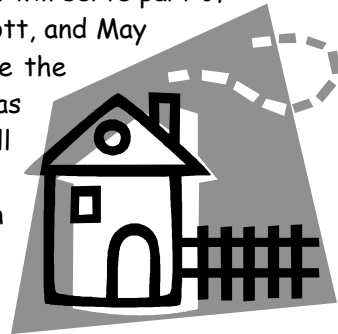
LOCAL SCOUTS HONORED

Four former Anchorage Public School students (2003 alumni) received the Eagle Scout Award, the highest honor in Boy Scouts, at a Court of Honor held at Anchorage Presbyterian Church on September 10, 2006. Jack Resinger, Troop 110 Scoutmaster, presided over the event attended by more than 100 guests.

Preston Bates is a senior at Trinity High School. His Eagle Scout project combined two passions: his tree-hugging environmentalism and his advocacy for Louisville. At the Louisville Nature Center, Preston eliminated insidious and invasive plants out of several acres to promote the concept of biodiversity. **Matthew Brendel** is a senior enrolled at duPont Manual High School. His Eagle Scout project aided the Episcopal Church Home in Lyndon, Kentucky by providing the necessary funding and labor to remodel its Alzheimer unit's patio garden. **Drew Schulz** is a senior at duPont Manual High School. Drew has held positions with Troop 110 as Patrol Leader, Assistant Senior Patrol leader and Webmaster. For his service project he organized and led a children's book drive, then donated the books to an English-as-a-Second-Language (ESL) tutoring program. **Alex Vestal** is a senior at Trinity High School. His Eagle Scout project benefited the Anchorage Presbyterian Church. Alex planned, designed, and led his fellow Scouts and volunteers to construct a permanent in-ground fire pit for the youth groups, restored and painted a picnic table, and laid a patio adjacent to the children's playground. Matt, Drew, Preston and Alex would like to thank everyone who helped them reach the rank of Eagle Scout.

SEWER EXPANSION UPDATE

Survey work for the project is nearly complete except in the area that will serve part of Osage Road East. Also, the representative of Fuller, Mossbarger, Scott, and May Engineers has visited 90 of the 95 homes to be served to determine the location and elevation of the existing line leaving the home. This was necessary to assure the new sewer would adequately serve all properties. Later in the design phase the tentative location of the sewer tap for each property will be determined based on design factors, locations of trees and property improvements, and the home's existing sewer line. Before the location of the sewer tap is finalized, each homeowner will be given adequate time to comment on the location and if necessary, meet with the engineers to consider a better location.



Anchorage Auditorium Renovation Campaign Kicking Off
