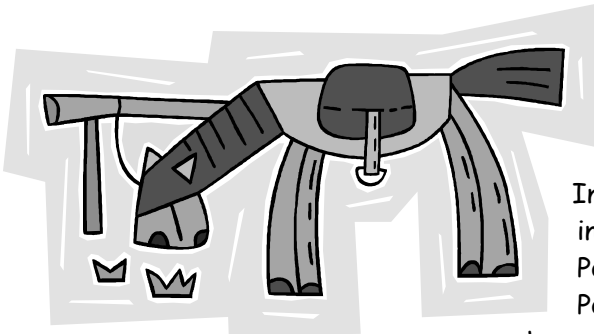

CELEBRATES 50 YEARS!**



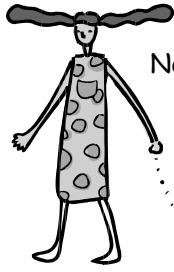

Residents on this list will be checked on during a natural or man-made emergency event.

### **ANCHORFEST CELEBRATES 25 YEARS**

Anchorfest will be 25 years old this year!

Twenty-five years ago a committee of the Civic Club, including Chairman Becky Miller, Juanita Wagner, Martha Kincheloe, Frank Harshaw, and Janet Carson were given the task of finding a way to welcome new residents to Anchorage. Becky came up with the idea of **Anchorfest** at a meeting held in Martha's backyard. The Volunteer Fire Department had some experience handling a crowd of residents through their fish fries and they were asked to be co-sponsors. Thus the first **Anchorfest** was held on October 14, 1982, at the then new firehouse. Its purpose was to provide an opportunity for new residents to meet not only other residents, but also the officials and employees of the City of Anchorage.

Juanita Wagner began the first of her thirteen years cooking dinner. With the help of Irma Watson, the wonderful manager of the cafeteria at Anchorage School, the food was prepared at the school and driven over to the firehouse. The menu hasn't changed much over the years. It is still hot dogs, brats soaked in beer and grilled by various Anchorage chefs, baked beans with its secret recipe of a dash of chili powder, slaw, chips, soft drinks, coffee, and beer. Applesauce, juice and wine were added later. Guests were asked to bring a dessert. Years later the Anchorage Garden Club took over the desserts and the cooking was moved to Anchorage Presbyterian Church. (Juanita laughingly said recently that it would have been a whole lot easier to have baked chicken casseroles.)

The evening included a hayride for children and a German band, the "Hot Brats", lead by Charlie Lorenz. A street dance was held on Evergreen Road .
